The EC Initiative “Support Member States under particular migratory pressure in their response to health related challenges”

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28 October 2015

The Directorate General for Health and Food Safety (DG SANTE) published an amendment to the Annual Work Programme 2015 under the EU Health Programme, in order to include horizontal actions on "Supporting Member States under particular migratory pressure in their response to health related challenges".

This was in response to the high influx of refugees and other migrants being faced by the EU.

The amended work programme 2015 refers to horizontal actions related to the specific objectives 1 and 2 of the Programme, namely:

1. In order to promote health, prevent diseases, and foster supportive environments for healthy lifestyles: identify, disseminate and promote the uptake of evidence-based and good practices for cost-effective health promotion and disease prevention measures by addressing in particular the key lifestyle related risk factors with a focus on the added value for the Union.

2. In order to protect Union citizens from serious cross-border health threats:

identify and develop coherent approaches and promote their implementation for better preparedness and coordination in health emergencies.

Project grants: objectives

Provide support to Member States/other countries participating in the 3rd Health Programme under particular migratory pressure and to non-governmental organisation working in those Member States to help address the health related issues of arriving migrants while preventing and addressing possible communicable diseases and cross-border health threats, in particular at the designated hotspots and in the areas of reception of refugees and other migrants.

Project grants: expected results

Re-enforced response capacity of the Member States under particular migratory pressure to provide the arriving refugees and migrants with initial health assessments and preventive measures, including for children and other vulnerable groups, and thus contributing to combating cross border health threats.

Grant to IOM: objectives and expected results

Provide IOM with additional means to support the response of Member States/other countries participating in the 3rd Health Programme to serious health threats related to the influx of refugees and other migrants.

Improved capacity in Member States under particular migratory pressure to respond to serious health threats related to the influx of refugees and other migrants.

What different from the other call for proposals

- Pertinence of the geographical coverage, defined by the areas of implementation (AWARD CRITERIA, activities to be carried out in at least 3 countries eligible under the 3rd HP and in areas particularly affected by high influx of refugees and other migrants);
- Mono vs multi-beneficiary grant agreements;
- Exceptional utility (80%) co-funding;
- Horizontal Work-Packages (only WP1 (Coordination) mandatory)

Refugee crisis: Commission grants €5.5 million to Health projects to support Member States' actions

The Commission is supporting EU countries at the forefront of the refugee crisis with grants from the [EU Health Programme](#) totalling €5.5 million for four projects. The funds are meant to help addressing common health challenges in the most affected Member States. A grant to the International Organisation of Migration (IOM) will be used for testing a personal health record which aims to reconstruct the medical history of migrants and evaluate their health needs. Three additional projects – to be carried out by Médecins du Monde, regional authorities and academics – will receive grants to provide immediate support to Member States such as protocols and clinical guidelines, language and communication tools and capacity building, including training. The Health Programme is also supporting longer-term actions on refugees and migrants' health and integration and more projects can be envisaged. *(For more information: Enrico Brivio – Tel.: +32 229 56172; Aikaterini Apostola - Tel.: +32 229 87624)*

Roles and responsibilities

- Project Coordinator

- Monitor that the action is implemented properly;
- Act as the intermediary for all communications between the beneficiaries and the Agency;
- Request and review any documents or information required by the Agency and verify their completeness and correctness before passing them on to the Agency;
- Submit the deliverables and reports to the Agency;
- Must ensure that all payments are made to the other beneficiaries without unjustified delay;
- Must inform the Agency of the amounts paid to each beneficiary, when required in the or requested by the Agency.

Roles and responsibilities

- Co-beneficiaries

Keep information stored in the Beneficiary Register (in the electronic exchange system) up to date;

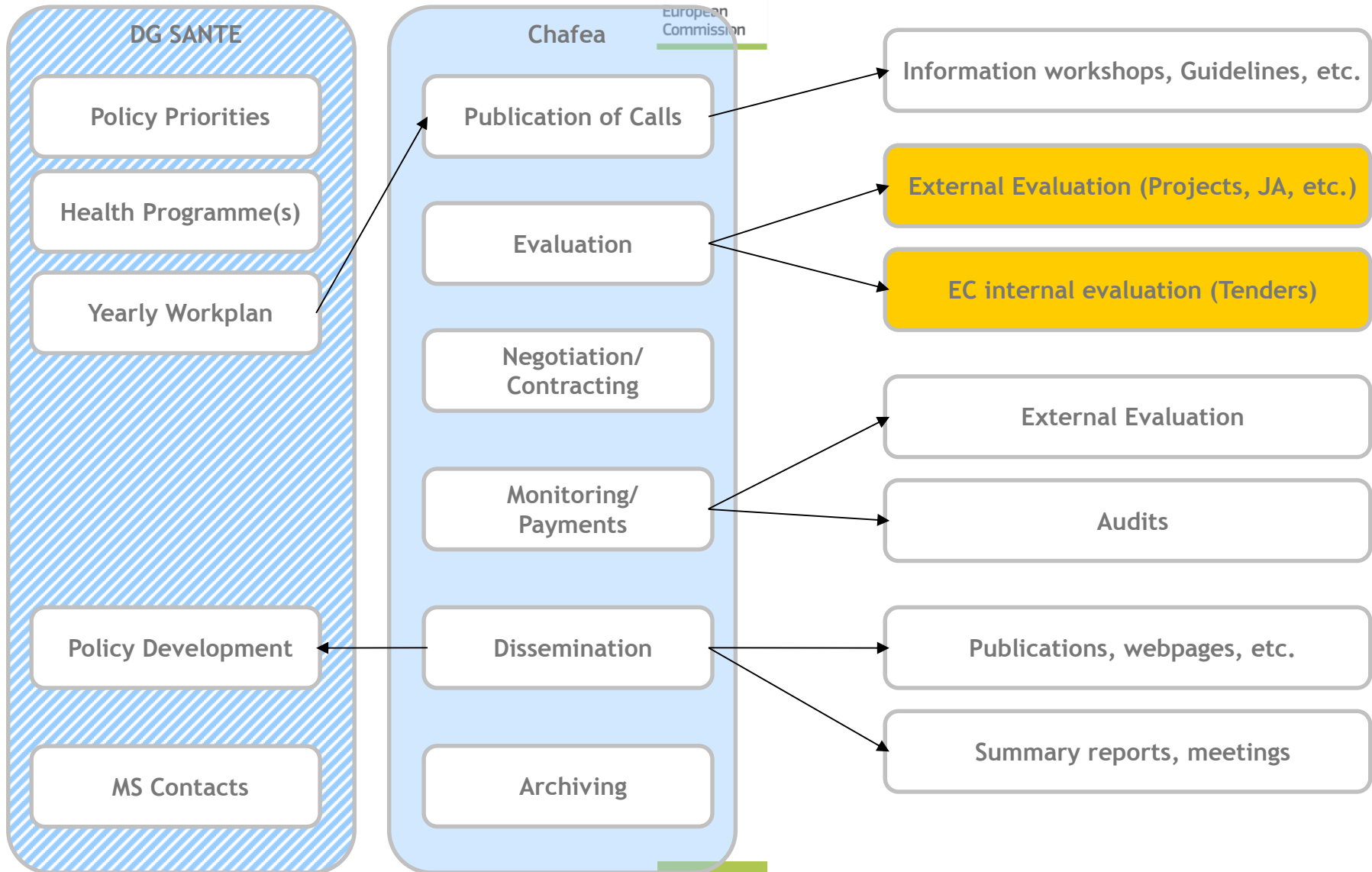
Inform the coordinator immediately of any events or circumstances likely to affect significantly or delay the implementation of the action;

Submit to the coordinator in good time:

- Individual financial statements for itself and its affiliated entities (if applicable) and, if required, certificates on the financial statements;
- the data needed to draw up the technical reports;
- If applicable, ethics committee opinions and notifications or authorisations for activities raising ethical issues;
- Any other document(s) or information required by the Agency or the Commission under the grant agreement, unless the grant agreement requires the beneficiary to submit this information directly to the Agency or the Commission.



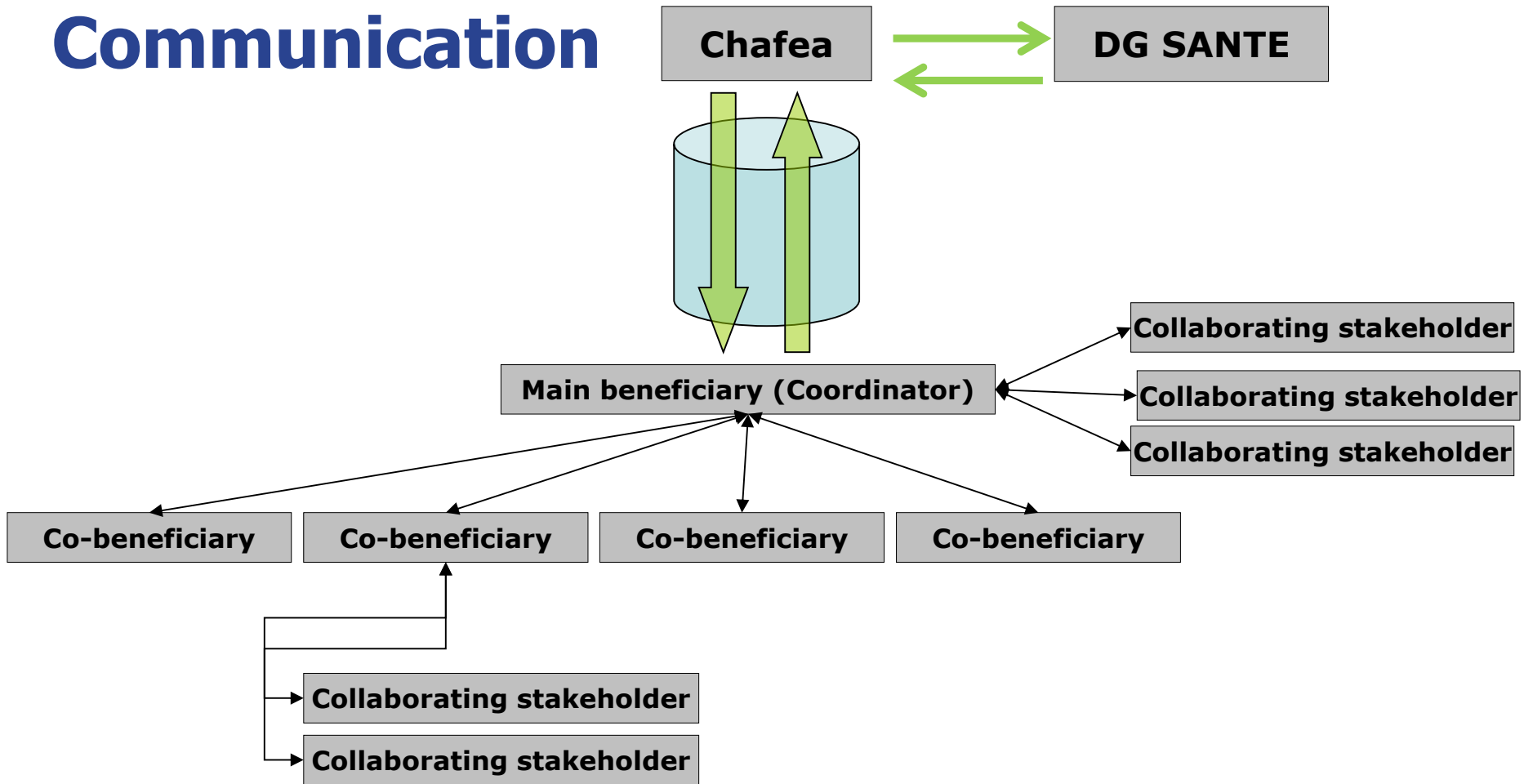

EC visual identity and visibility of EU funding

ARTICLE 22 — PROMOTING THE ACTION — VISIBILITY OF EU FUNDING

22.1 Communication activities by the beneficiaries

22.1.1 General obligation to promote the action and its results

The beneficiaries must promote the action and its results.

22.1.2 Information on EU funding — Obligation and right to use of the EU emblem

Unless the Agency requests or agrees otherwise, any communication activity related to the action (including at conferences, seminars, in information material, such as brochures, leaflets, posters, presentations, etc., in electronic form, via social media, etc.) and any infrastructure, equipment or major results funded by the grant must:

- (a) display the EU emblem and
- (b) include the following text:

"This [insert appropriate description, e.g. report, publication, conference, infrastructure, equipment, insert type of result, etc.] is part of the project / joint action '717275 / SH-CAPAC' which has received funding from the European Union's Health Programme (2014-2020)."

When displayed in association with another logo, the EU emblem must have appropriate prominence.

22.1.3 Disclaimer excluding Agency/Commission responsibility

Any communication activity related to the action must indicate the following disclaimer:
